It is time to make your reservations for the adult (18 years and over) Fall Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge. We will have two classes. The teachers are Karen Nelson and Onya Tolmasoff.

We will be painting a 10" beaded scoop plate. Karen is teaching a Hallingdal design using JoSonja Russet as the background color. Onya is teaching a Vest Agder design on a blue galaxy background..: I am attaching copies of the pictures to this notice.

Please make your bed reservation with me. I develop the list of who is in which room. You will pay for your bed when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. If you can't locate your membership card, bring the last issue of your Viking Magazine. It has your number in the address box. Members pay \$16.20 per night; guests pay \$27.00 for beds in the dorms, which includes 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$25 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$35 per night for RV's. Camp has electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$20 for non members. No occupancy tax on RV's or tents. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please include your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. The supply lists will be sent when I receive your registration form and check. ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL RESERVATION REQUESTS. I need the check and registration form together. Be sure to send a self addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. I will not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a selfaddressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form

The cost of the seminar will be \$87 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, hall rent, and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee for any cancellations, but absolutely no cancellations after Sept .1st It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least a couple of weeks to make their plans, so please be thoughtful. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$87 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. We will ask just one class to bring cookies, and will rotate those classes each time. The information will be on your supply list.

Edvard Munch as Seen through the Eyes of Andy Warhol

As a pioneer of modern art, Edvard Munch has undoubtedly left behind a legacy of some of the most famous artworks in history. His work has appeared in exhibitions all over the world, and been the inspiration behind many other well-known artists. Among those artists is the late Andy Warhol, a standout in the visual arts movement of the 1960s.

While many may think the artistic universes of Andy Warhol and Edvard Munch to be polar opposites, the Munch Museum's newest exhibition, "Andy Warhol—After Munch," sheds light on the surprising comparisons between the two and the impact that the Norwegian artist had on the pop art icon.

The exhibit in Oslo runs from May 26-August 26 and features 15 of Warhol's paintings. Each piece is based off of four of Munch's images and manages to bring a whole new meaning to his original work.

Communications Director for the Munch Museum Gitte Skilbred states, "The exhibit challenges viewers to discover a deeper layer to Warhol's art than he's sometimes given credit for. At the same time, one might find a greater degree of accessibility in Munch's art when his motifs are experienced through Warhol's interpretations."

Minutes of the Board Meeting

Wednesday, June 20th, 2018

CALL TO ORDER: President Susan Cody called the meeting to order at 7:19 PM. There were 10 board members present: they are listed at the end of the minutes.

Chris Houston from the La Mesa Masonic Lodge was present prior to the board meeting with a draft of the new contract. Susan and Allen reviewed it and found it to be incomplete, Chris will make corrections and present it at a later date for review.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:

The minutes from March board meeting were accepted as printed in the April Valhall Viking #3.

COMMITTEE AND DIRECTOR REPORTS:

Social: Judy reported that we will serve Får I kål at the September social. Susan will help cook and there are enough helpers on the committee.

Newsletter: Arlene reported that she learned a lot at the convention. Sons of Norway no longer gives a Newsletter Award, they now give a Communications Award which includes newsletter, website and use of other social media to promote your lodge.

There was discussion of how we could improve updating our Facebook page. Not everyone is authorized to add to the page. Aprell is looking into this. Susan added that she will be Publicity Director next year and will look into new ways to promote our lodge. The new T-shirts provide publicity. A member asked if we have considered having a booth at the Vista Viking Festival. No current plans for that.

Website: Steve reported that he will add our address change, effective 9/1/18 to the website. He will also add the new 2019 calendar as soon as it is provided to him.

Nominating Committee: Aprell continues to seek members to fill open positions. She will start making phone calls in addition to the emails she's been sending. A proposed slate of officers will be presented to the members in the October newsletter, and the vote will be at the Nov. lodge meeting.

Foundation: (1) Rick reported that Valhall received the King Harald medal at the convention.

(2) Rick mentioned that donations for Camp Norge sent through the Foundation will now be tax deductible.

AWARDS:

Susan reported that we received several awards at the convention:

- 1. Silver Communication Award
- 2. Silver Family Lodge of the Year
- 3. Silver President's Award

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Janet is finishing up the By-laws revision. There was only one change which will read: "Affiliate Dues, in accordance with Sons of Norway by-laws will be the same amount as local lodge dues (this is \$14)". April made the motion to approve this, Steve seconded and the motion was passed.
- 2. A revised contract still needs to be reviewed and signed as soon as possible
- 3. Scheduling events related to the move to La Mesa Mason's Lodge:
- (1) July 7 or August 11 will be the move date. Rick will coordinate renting a Pod, emptying and dismantling the shed, and moving all to the new location. If lodge members wish to help out, please contact Rick to coordinate. A small work crew will be needed with several battery powered drills to remove shed from wood foundation.
- (2) Board members will box up library books/albums and cabinet contents following tonight's board meeting. Those items will be stored in our shed.
- (3) Library books will be offered to members at the September meeting and/or social, remaining books will be donated to a local library.
- (4) Aprell will take care of SON paperwork to change the official mailing address of the lodge. Susan Cody's home address will be used for now.

NEW BUSINESS:

(1) At a previous board meeting it was proposed to give members a free dinner coupon to be used at a social of their choice. Since this will be finan-

- cially difficult to administer, the board decided to lower the cost of the September Heritage Social to \$5 for everyone, members and non-members. This will be a great way to celebrate membership appreciation and encourage new members to join. We will also acknowledge new members to Valhall Lodge.
- (2) Our current Financial Benefits Counselor (FBC) lives far away and has been unable to attend our socials in recent times. It is very likely that we will soon be assigned a new local counselor to help members with their insurance needs.
- (3) We will need to purchase a coffee machine for the new lodge location. It will be similar to the one here at Ascension Lutheran and will cost approximately \$300. Susan proposed that she could write an equipment grant to SON to cover the expense.
- (4) We will also need our own microphone system at the new location. We think Sven has the old one and we'll see if that will meet our needs, otherwise the SON equipment grant could be for a new microphone system.
- (5) Susan proposed that we adjust the dates for our quarterly board meetings. Since we won't be paying rent for July and August, we will have the board meetings in January, April, June and September.
- (6) Allen reported that one lodge communication is still being sent to Tommy Drive. Susan will contact the sender and get the address corrected. The board meeting was attended by: Susan Cody, Richard Hausvik, Allen Johannesen, Janet Weber, Stephen Rawlinson, Maury Lee, Judy Sawyer, Aprell Bigler, Arlene LaBree and Myla Coleman.
