We Are All In This Together

While we are self isolating in the United States, Norway has taken drastic action to control the spread of the coronavirus. Prime Minister Erna Solberg imposed drastic measures that were to last for two weeks during the latter part of March. She closed all Norwegian airports to foreign citizens who are not residents of Norway. She closed all schools, kindergartens and universities. She banned most public events. Bars and restaurants were closed except when they could keep customers at least one meter apart. Many closed regardless because they experienced a drastically reduced number of customers. Anybody who had travelled abroad since February 27 was home quarantined for 14 days. ("Abroad" meant outside of Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Iceland and Norway.) Supermarkets and pharmacies remained open.

These drastic measures were taken in part because the spread of the coronavirus in Norway could no longer be tracked. Closure extended to cultural events, sports events and organized sports activities, most establishments in the hospitality industry, gyms, companies that offered hairdressing services, skin care, massage and body care, tattooing, piercing, etc. and swimming pools, water parks, etc.

5 Facts About Norway's King

February 21 marked the 80th birthday of His Majesty King Harald V of Norway. In honor of this special occasion, here are five facts you might not know about the monarch.

1. First Norwegian king born in Norway in 567 years.

Although Norway's history dates back many centuries, the country's status as a modern independent nation is comparatively young. Due to the lengthy union with Denmark and later Sweden, many monarchs of Norway hailed from other European countries. The election of King Haakon VII (Harald's grandfather) in 1905 marked the first monarch chosen by an independent Norway since the Middle Ages.

2. He is an Olympian.

An avid sailor, H.M. King Harald represented Norway three times in the Olympics, participating in the 1964, 1968 and 1972 games. He and his crew also won World Championship bronze, silver and gold medals in 1988, 1982 and 1987. In 2005, they won the European Championships with the Fram XV.

3. He extended his Royal Patronage to the Sons of Norway Foundation.

In 1992 King Harald became a patron of the Sons of Norway Foundation. During subsequent years the king has affirmed continual confidence in the mission and philanthropy of the Foundation by renewing his patronage through 2020.

4. A portion of the Arctic is named after him.

Over 2,500 square miles of eastern Svalbard was dubbed "Harald V Land" by the Norwegian Polar Institute in honor of the king in 2013. King Harald is the third Norwegian monarch—preceded by Olav V and Haakon VII—to have part of Svalbard named in his honor. In 2015 he was the world's first reigning monarch to visit Antarctica.

5. His courtship was unique.


Then Crown Prince, Harald broke from tradition when he married Sonja Haraldsen, a commoner, after a nine-year courtship. After consulting with the Presidium of the Storting, parliamentary leaders and the Norwegian government, King Olav gave his permission for the couple to marry in March of 1968. On Aug. 29, 1968, Harald and Sonja were married at Oslo Cathedral.

Norwegian Performance Group Wardruna Coming to El Cajon on October 16

Wardruna is difficult to classify. Their performance is not like anything else you've ever seen--part music, part drama, part history lesson, part poetry. Led by Einar Selvik, they've released three albums and have a worldwide following. They are dedicated to creating musical renditions of cultural and esoteric Norse traditions, and make significant use of historical and traditional Nordic instruments. They also contributed music to History Channel's series VIKINGS, and Einar appeared in two episodes.

From their bio:

"Wardruna merge academics with pop culture, and their thorough and serious approach has made them one of today's foremost communicators of Norse culture. Today's top international scholars on Old Norse studies use Einar's work to exemplify how music might have been executed in earlier times in Scandinavia and he has lectured about his work with historical music in prestigious universities such as Oxford, Reykjavik University, and University of Bergen. Wardruna was commissioned by the Norwegian government to write and perform a music piece for the 200-year anniversary of the Norwegian constitution in 2014."

Conventions Postponed until 2022

Dear Members,

Sons of Norway has been closely monitoring the global COVID-19 crisis and its impact on the upcoming 2020 District and International Lodge meetings. The Sons of Norway International Board of Directors has voted to postpone the International Lodge Meeting and Convention scheduled for August 2020 in Ringsaker, Norway. Pursuant to the national emergency provisions in the Charter and Constitutions, the meeting will be postponed until 2022.

In addition, the International Board, through its interim authority granted by the International Lodge, has voted to postpone all 2020 District Lodge meetings until 2022. These postponements serve to continue the 2018-2020 biennium into the year 2022. It is expected that all district and international delegates and those installed in leadership positions for the 2018-2020 biennium will continue in service until the regular session lodge meetings of 2022.

We understand that these postponements present a litany of questions, which we will answer in the near future as the scope of this global health emergency is further defined. For now, the best way to move our organization through this crisis is to keep the current structure in place, as stipulated in the Charter and Constitutions.

District Six Announcement About the Convention

Greetings All,

Based on the questions coming into the District Six Officers, some of the information we sent out over the past two days is not clear. We hope the fillowing will help your understanding.

- The 2020 District Six Lodge Meeting & Convention in Mesa, Arizona is postponed until 2022 as per the decision of the International Board of Directors.
 - Terminology The District Six Lodge Meeting is the business part of the Convention.
 The extra activities such as workshops or seminars, the Folk Art Exhibition & Competition, the Recreation Center Board Meeting, meals and social time, vendors, etc. are also part of the convention. Often, to simplify, the word 'convention' is used to mean the District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention
- The International Lodge Meeting and Convention is postponed until 2022.
- Local lodges shall comply with any local, state, and federal guidelines for meeting.
- The 2018 <u>district delegates</u> remain as delegates until the district convention in 2022. They will act on any referenda brought forth by the District Board of Directors. The 2018 alternates will take the place of any 2018 delegates not able to continue their service.
 - O The District Board is likely to present referenda during this biennium, as there are a couple of district related resolutions that the board would like to act on before 2022. Delegates may also be called upon to approve various reports via referendum, so that the 2022 delegates are not reviewing reports and financials from 2018 and 2019.
- The 2018 <u>international delegates</u> remain as delegates until the international convention in 2022. They will act on any referenda brought forth by the International Board of Directors. The 2018 international alternates will take the place of any 2018 international delegates not able to continue their service.
- All <u>district and international officers and directors</u> for the 2018-2020 biennium will continue in service until the regular district lodge and international lodge meetings of 2022. Those not wishing to continue may submit a resignation letter. Procedures in the Charter and Constitutions allow the district and international boards to make replacement appointments from among the 2018 delegates.

This COVID-19 crisis has put us in uncharted territory and uncertainty, but we have an organizational structure to move forward. In the face of these unsure and daunting times, we can share our heritage and care for each other through phone calls, social media, lodge newsletters, emails, etc. When we get through this crisis, we then can gather together as lodges, boards, committees, and other entities once again, perhaps with more enthusiasm and thankfulness.
