It was great seeing many of you at last month's lodge meeting for Susan's lovely lemon-y chicken piccata lunch, Thelma's beautiful berry bundt cake and the sharing of heritage items and family stories. Jerry brought a simply carved wooden



spoon; its worn surface told of generations of use. Jean had another household item, a wooden bowl with a crack held together with an iron pin, telling the story of how items were repaired in a time of scarcity. Judy had a leather-bound journal with ledgers and records of the family business. Tucked and folded in the back of it was her relative's immigration certificate. I wore my heritage item: a delicate white and blue enamel link bracelet with maker's mark of David-Andersen Jewelers, still in business today with shops in Oslo.

Hello, as in <u>HELLO! - ATTENTION!</u> To high school seniors and current college students. It's time to start thinking about 2024! There are a variety of scholarships available for <u>college</u>, trade schools, and study abroad, from \$1,500 to \$20,000+.

Go to the Sons of Norway website at www.sofn.com and click on Foundation. Then click on Scholarships and read about each one and who is eligible to apply. When you find one or more for which you qualify, read the Overview, Who Can Apply, and View Guidelines. Now, think about what you have to do to apply . . . and here are a few suggestions:

- 1. Treat the application as if it is a job application. Be thorough in completing all requirements of the application. Make a list of all the application requirements and check them off when completed. Then, double check before submitting. If any requirement is not completed, your application will automatically be rejected.
- 2. Read and study the Criteria section of the application. In your essay, you are asked to address six (6) key points. Use specific, experiential examples when answering these key points, especially your connection to Sons of Norway.
- 3. How did you find out about the Sons of Norway Foundation scholarship and/or what do you know about the Sons of Norway Foundation? Show you did more research than just a Google search.
- 4. Emphasize your community or school volunteer work.

We are excited to bring these opportunities to you! We believe you have the potential to be an excellent candidate. The applications are due in several months and we hope – indeed **RECOMMEND**, you start now to create a compelling application.

There is also the current meaning on the Internet of unkind people who leave offensive or annoying messages to get attention or cause trouble.

So on to the Internet to *root* out words of Norse origin! Some words were familiar for those who study our history: *saga, berserk, viking* (Auto-correct is saying it needs to be capitalized as a noun. It doesn't know that viking is also a verb, meaning to travel and explore). During Halloween, ghosts and witches *haunt* the world. At Christmas we hear of glad *tidings*. The person who is invited is known as a *guest*. A butterfly *flits* from flower to flower.

With Wikipedia, the knowledge has links to sources that are cited and so I *regret* to admit that I spent some precious time in the rabbit hole of information overload. *Until* that keeps me from doing important things like work and spending time with family, I think it's okay.

Presentation: The Norwegian 'Mayflower': The Voyage of the Restauration

Date: Tuesday, October 10 (8 PM CDT, 7 PM MDT, 6 PM PDT)

Speaker: Dale Goodman, Former Vesterheim Trustee

Program Description: In the period beginning in 1825 and for about 100 years following, nearly 40% of the population of Norway – more than 800,000 Norwegians – immigrated to the United States. Most of those immigrants came for "economic opportunity," but the first immigrants – known as the Sloopers of 1825 – came for religious freedom. The voyage was three years in the planning by an alliance of Quakers and Haugean Lutherans. Beginning on July 4th, 1825, a 54-foot sloop named Restaurasjonen (The Restauration) took 52 passengers on a 98-day journey from Stavanger, Norway to New York City. This presentation follows the story from its roots (in the Napoleonic Wars), through the voyage itself, the reception in New York City, and finally to the first Norwegian settlement in the United States in Kendall, New York. Foundation Information

Thank you for the opportunity to visit with you about the Sons of Norway Foundation.

"The mission of the Sons of Norway Foundation is to celebrate Nordic culture and heritage through scholarships and grants to our members and communities."

In 2023 the Foundation provided 37 scholarships for \$190,500 and 32 grants for \$54,156.

In our district, in 2023 our members received 4 scholarships for \$7,000 and 3 grants for \$3,920.

Over the past 5 years (2019 - 2023), the Foundation has provided our members and lodges \$884,436 in scholarships and grants.

October is "Foundation Month". And from October 1 through January 15, 2024 we will be engaged in the "Together We Are the Future" campaign to financially strengthen the Foundation.

The 2023 goal of "Together We Are the Future" campaign is to raise \$185,000 through our lodges and members to strengthen the Foundation to provide more scholarships and grants. Another words, to fulfill the Foundation's mission.

Since its inception of the "Together . . . " campaign in 2020, our lodges and members have grown the Foundation by \$496,600.

I might add that the current assets of the Foundation are over \$11,300,000.

This past year, our lodge's corporation has donated \$400 to the Foundation. For that we thank you.

Here are options about donating:

Those who have donated in the past will receive a letter with a return envelope to send in your donation.

However, if you have not made a donation in the past, I'm asking that you consider writing a check to the Foundation and add you Sons of Norway membership number in the "MEMO" space. We will collect the checks at our monthly meetings in October, November, and December. We'll give them to our Treasurer who will forward them to the Foundation each month.
