Valhall Corporation Meeting Minutes April 28, 2025 (2nd Quarter)

The meeting was held via Zoon and was called to order by President James Adams at 7:00 PM

Present were President James Adams, Vice President Andreas Ueland, Treasurer Steve Rawlinson, Secretary Everett Shogren, Lodge President Myla Coleman and directors Judy Sawyer and Millie Wright.

Old Business:

It was moved, seconded and passed to accept the minutes from the meeting of February 11, 2025

Treasurer Steve Rawlinson will present the annual Corporation report to the membership at the at the May 10, 2025 Lodge meeting. The report will show the the current financial status, keeping the presentation focused and concise

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Treasurer Steve Rawlinson.

Steve presented the Treasurers report, discussing the stock market's performance and the impact of inflation. He also shared a new slide from a recent presentation, emphasizing the consistent upward trend in the stock market over the past 97 years. Steve then presented the budget for the current year, highlighting the inflation factor and the adjustments made to different buckets. He also discussed the financial performance of Bucket 3, which has underperformed. The main action item from the meeting was to address the performance of Bucket 3 and explore ways to improve its return.

Steve discussed the management of fixed income investments, including the use of a cash management account, money market fund, and treasury notes.

The board discussed the potential of managing a limited portion financial investments themselves, rather than relying on a professional manager. However, concerns were raised about the potential risks and liabilities involved. Steve presented a proposal for a new system, but the team decided not to proceed with it. Instead, they agreed to ask the lodge members for their ideas on managing the finances.

Toilet Troubles

Judy will coordinate with Mason representatives to select and purchase a chair-height toilet with round bowl from Home Depot for the women's bathroom before the next social on May 10th The current fixture is too low for many people.

The next Corporation Board meeting was scheduled for October 6, 2025 at 7:00 PM on Zoom. Any lodge member is invited to attend. Contact Steve Rawlinson for details.

Barb Johnson's Lapskaus Soup

Barb Johnson is a Sons of Norway member of Polar Star Lodge #5-472 in Aurora, IL. She recently won a friendly competition in a soup cook-off at her lodge.

Ingredients:

- 1.5 pounds of chuck roast
- 3/4 pound carrots
- one celery root
- 3/4 cut rutabagas
- 1 small leek
- 1 small onion
- 2 large parsnips
- 3 cups broth
- Salt and pepper
- (Potatoes)

Ed note: Potatoes were not on the list of the supplied recipe, but they are mentioned below.



How to make:

Use boiled or baked meat, fresh, salted or a mixture. Cut meat into even pieces and set aside. Wash and peel carrots, celery root and rutabagas, and dice. In soup pot, bring broth to a boil and add vegetables. Cook 15 minutes. Peel and dice potatoes. Cut leeks lengthwise and wash thoroughly and slice, add peeled sliced onion and potatoes to pot. Cook until almost tender. Add meat and leftover gravy. Salt and pepper to taste. Meat, vegetables and potatoes should be tender but not mushy. Stir while cooking.
